

### IN TOUCH WITH ALUMNI

I attended St. Mary's from 1984-1997. Or as my 7 year old likes to remind me, "Mom, you went to school in the 1900's!" I feel blessed that my kindergarten through 12th grade years were so strongly connected by being at a K-12 school and I'm so grateful for the foundation which was laid for me.

I can remember exactly which classroom I was in for all years of grade school. I remember when the "new gym" was built in 1988 and we spent our recess time by the football field concession stand during construction that year. I remember learning prayers, May crownings, building Homecoming floats, basketball games, Christmas programs, and Marathons. I remember algebra and science labs, and Church history. I even recall singing the books of the Bible...and still use that song as a resource today!

One of the smaller details I recall was making a button in grade school inked with my thumbprint. The caption on it read, "you are special." There was something imparted on us while making those buttons and I believe it is what God wants all of us to know deep within ourselves - That He has made us for a great purpose, each person is not only special but unique and perfect in His eyes, and He loves us more than we can imagine. Among all of the important things that a Catholic school can teach this is perhaps the most important piece.

I am grateful for the many faithful teachers who cared for us and wanted us to know that God-given dignity we possess. The leadership of **Wayne Pelzel ('68)** and **Jerry Neubauer** held us to high standards, to help us grow in virtue as well as in academics. One of the anchors at the time of my attendance at St. Mary's was **Monsignor John Richter**. His steady presence

as pastor, his deep faith and unwavering commitment to the Gospel was a place of strength for our whole community.

Of course, like any Catholic school, when a partnership with parents is established it gives a child the opportunity to learn and experience their academics and faith more fully. This is something I felt in our home growing up. My parents, Chuck ('72) and Kathy (Moran '72) Spaeth made our Catholic faith a priority in our home and my sisters (Rachel '99, Amanda '03, Mary '05) and I saw the beauty of what the Church taught through our mom and dad and their example. It's also important to note that living near my grandparents, Sylvia and Moe Moran, and Sylvester and Delores Spaeth was a tremendous gift and had a lovely influence on our lives. Today I am especially grateful for the impact of all of this on our family and the relationships my sisters and I share.

Interestingly, upon graduating from St. Mary's my sisters and I all went to the same college: The University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. I also met my husband David Fischer while we were both students at St. Thomas. And although his name sounds like it could be from Sleepy Eye, his family name actually hails from New York! We were married at St. Mary's 21 years ago and have been blessed with 9 children ages 2-20. It is primarily because of my education at St. Mary's I knew that I wanted our children to attend Catholic school K-12.

We too have found the partnership with our dedicated teachers and pastors to be an incredible tool in forming our children. We keep life full by attending our children's many athletic and other activities, but we also make serving in our parish and schools a priority. With our own experiences of the sacrifices and challenges that come with marriage and family life, we've connected ourselves to various groups that encourage us in our daily prayer, relationship with Jesus and faithfulness to the Church. Every Friday morning throughout the school year my home fills up with about 40 people for a women's bible study with childcare included. David leads a regular men's gathering at church, with bacon included. And we together began a monthly couples event for all married couples in our parish to strengthen marriage and discuss topics that don't always get attention in the midst of busy lives. We really believe that building up the domestic church is a way to build up the whole Church, so much of our life is devoted to this effort.

After venturing into the broadcasting world for a few years after college I feel blessed to now stay home with our children. Part of David's work over the last several years has included being an Executive Producer on a few movies. This May the feature film SIGHT released in theaters. SIGHT tells the incredible true journey of

Dr. Ming Wang from a poor immigrant to becoming a world renowned eye surgeon who can restore eye-sight to certain types of blindness. After meeting Dr. Wang 10 years ago, David knew more people needed to hear his story. So, as the producer for SIGHT, David brought this film from its inception all the way to 2000 theaters on May 24, 2024.

We're very proud of SIGHT. And although our upbringings differ quite a bit from Dr. Wang's childhood in China, the themes of the movie can resonate with all of us. Seeing the way God can use any hardships of our past to create goodness and joy in the present and recognizing the beauty and uniqueness of every human being are just a couple of those themes.

To that end, I pray that an education at St. Mary's can continue to be a foundation for all students to know the truth that they are unique and that God loves them and has a special plan just for them. Perhaps this truth is even more important to remind ourselves of as we get older...especially for those of us who lived and went to school way back in the 1900's!
